- **Supervision:** All competitors are to sit with the Team Coach in the spectator area throughout the day except when they are competing.
- <u>**Transport:**</u> Students will have to make their own way to and from the venue. Students are to be at the venue by 8.45am.

<u>Dress:</u> Full school uniform and hat are to be worn, and no jewellery is allowed. Appropriate shoes must be worn (students may bring boots for Rugby League and Soccer).

Special requirements:

Students participating in Rugby League are required to wear a **mouth guard**. Students participating in Soccer are required to have **shin pads**.

- **Protection:** Children need to bring their recess and lunch and will also need to bring plenty to drink throughout the day (no glass bottles). There will be **LIMITED** canteen facilities available on the day.
- **Behaviour:** Werrington Public School takes pride in the positive feedback we have received about the behaviour of our students in previous P.S.S.A teams. If a student chooses not to follow the P.S.S.A. contract their position on the team will be reconsidered.

Important Information: All students have been asked to sign a P.S.S.A. contract that outlines all conditions regarding behaviour. Please take note of the Parent Code of Conduct set by Penrith P.S.S.A. for parents wishing to spectate.

PSSA CODE OF CONDUCT GUIDELINES

Dear Parents/ Carers,

The Primary School Sports Association (PSSA) and the school welcome parents to all games to support their children and school.

Sport provides many valuable learning experiences, but for most children enjoyment is the most important outcome. If they don't have fun, they will not want to play. All players, spectators, teachers and coaches are expected to follow the sport code of conduct guidelines in order to make every sporting experience a positive one for all concerned. Failure to follow these expectations can result in disciplinary action or exclusion from the sport, not only for players, but also for spectators and staff.

The expectations for spectators, players and staff are as follows.

Code of conduct for Spectators

- Remember that students play organised sport for their own enjoyment. They are not there to entertain you, and they are NOT miniature professional athletes
- Respect the officials' decisions
- Be on your best behaviour. Do not indulge in physical or verbal abuse of players, coaches, officials or
 - other spectators.
- Applaud good play by your own team and the opposing team
- Show respect for your opponents. Without them there will be no game
- Never ridicule a player for making a mistake or losing a competition
- Do not encourage or condone the use of violence in any form Encourage players always to play according to the rules

Code of Conduct for Players

- Play by the rules
- Never argue with an official (umpire/ referee/ manager)
- Control my temper and do not use verbal or physical abuse
- Work equally hard for myself and for my team
- Be a good sport and thank the opposition and officials at the end of the game
- Treat all participants in my sport as I would like to be treated
- Cooperate with my coach, team mates and opponents
- Participate for my own enjoyment and benefit, not just to please my parents and coaches
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
