Overview

Werrington Public School is committed to explicitly teaching and modelling positive behaviour and to supporting all students to be engaged with their learning. Key programs prioritised and valued by the school community are the Werrington Wise Award System, Smiling Mind and Bounce Back programs.

Promoting and reinforcing positive student behaviour and school-wide expectations

Werrington Public School has the following school-wide rules and expectations:

- Be Safe;
- Be Respectful; and
- Be a Learner.

Werrington Public School uses the following strategies and systems to explicitly teach, recognise and reinforce positive student behaviour and behavioural expectations:

- Weekly PBL assemblies focussing on a specific whole school value, determined by school data, and reinforced in classrooms across the week;
- Social and Emotional Learning, including Bounce Back is embedded into Personal Development, Health and Physical Education lessons across the school; and
- Werrington Wise Award System, aligned to our school values and expectations;
