Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Welcome back to term 4, it seems very odd to say that after we have only just completed our first term of face to face teaching.

Year 6 Farewell and Graduation and Presentation Day.

Following the release of the term four guidelines from the Department of Education, we are currently developing a plan for the year 6 farewell and graduation. Mr Bale is currently working with St Marys Band Club to organise the event this year. The year six farewell will look a little different to previous years with COVID restrictions; however,

we are working hard to create a memorable event for our students. St Marys Band Club is also a new venue for us as we had outgrown the previous venue. As soon as details have been finalised, information will be sent home to parents. The tentative date for our year 6 farewell is Tuesday 8th December.

Kindergarten Transition

Kindergarten transition will also look a little different to previous years. With the updated guidelines we are able to hold a transition program, however, there are still a number of challenges to work through. At this stage we anticipate Kindy transition being held on Thursday mornings in weeks 4, 5, 6 and 7, with staggered starts and pickups. Unfortunately, we are not able to hold face to face sessions for parents but we are developing some video content to replace these for parents, as well as an online Q&A session. As soon as details are finalised, this information will be forwarded to parents.

Operation Art

As the weather is warming up, please make sure that your child comes to school each day with a drink bottle. Due to current COVID restrictions, students can only use the bubblers to refill water bottles, not to drink directly from them.

Unfortunately due to Covid restrictions parents can not visit the book fair in person.



A focus on what parents can do to support their children

Parents gain knowledge regarding the symptoms displayed by children and adolescents with depression and/or anxiety. Parents gain a basic understanding of treatment, diagnosis, causes, related risk factors and practical strategies to support these children. SCHOOL ZONE OFFENCES

WHAT ARE YOU RISKING?*

FACT

Children are small, harder to see, behave unpredictably and are extremly vulnerable. They need **you** to take extra care when driving and parking around school zones

NO PARKING

No waiting. You have two minutes to drop-off or pickup. You must stay within three metres of your vehicle





NO STOPPING

You must not stop on a length of road with a no **stopping** sign. The first **10 metres** from an **intersection** is a no stopping zone. **Yellow kerb** lines are also a no stopping zone.





BUS ZONE

Only a public bus can stop in a bus zone





MOBILE PHONES

Extra fines apply for using a mobile phone in a school zone. May be subject to Double Demerits.





SPEEDING OFFENCES

40km/h is the limit. Children are vulnerable, so slow down in school zones. May be subject to Double Demerits.





DRIVEWAYS & FOOTPATHS

Do not park on or across a driveway or footpath.



PEDESTRIAN CROSSING

 In a queue of traffic, no part of your vehicle can stop on a pedestrian crossing.
 Do not let your children in our out of a vehicle at a pedestrian crossing as this is a no stopping zone.



U TURNS

U turns are illegal on or near a pedestrian crossing and across a double white line




DOUBLE

Double parking is illegal and is very dangerous in a school zone.
