Bushfire Response

As you may be aware the bushfire season has already commenced. Due to the bushland and grassland that surround Werrington, our school is classified as a category 2 bushfire risk. After consultation with the Cumberland District Rural Fire service, it was advised that our safest bushfire management plan, in the event of a local bushfire is to 'shelter in place'. The designated refuge within the school is the school library and C Block classrooms. The identified risk to the school is threat from possible ember attack and it was advised that it is

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preferable for emergency services to account for and protect students and staff, while sheltering in place on site. Should we need to shelter in place, all communications to parents will be via our SkoolBag app or Facebook page. Any relevant updates to the situation will be provided via the Skool-Bag app or Facebook, as soon as they are available to us. This will include, pick up information when emergency services deem it is safe to do so. We also encourage you to download the DoE School Updates, Fires Near Me and Live Traffic apps.

Planning for 2021

Currently we anticipate a similar number of classes for next year, however, numbers continue to fluctuate and we nearly have student numbers for a 19th mainstream class. Our building allocation indicates that we are entitled to an additional classroom as a learning programs space. Work to install this classroom has already begun, once built this will allow a classroom for RFF programs, or to establish a 19th class should the need arise.

We are well into planning for 2021. To help us with this, would you please advise the office if your child is not returning to Werrington Public School in 2021. Of course, you do not need to do this if your child is in Year 6! If you know of any families who are new to the area and considering attending Werrington Public School, could you please ask them to contact the school on 9623 7077 as soon as possible.

Road Safety

The safety of our students before and after school is of great concern. Penrith Council and the police do regular patrols of our school zones. Please note that there are significant fines and loss of demerit points for not following road rules and parking signs within school zones. Please utilise the school pedestrian crossings and follow the 'No Stopping, No Parking or Bus Stop' signs

Drink Bottles

As the weather is warming up, please make sure that your child comes to school each day with a drink bottle. Due to current COVID restrictions, students can only use the bubblers to refill water bottles, not to drink directly from them.

Updated COVID restrictions for schools.

Just a reminder from our update last week that all students and staff who experience cold or flu like symptoms <u>must</u> not attend school and need to be tested for COVID 19.

Students or staff who have had cold or flu like symptoms are not able to return to school until they are symptom free and have provided proof of a negative COVID 19 test to the school.

Gates open at 8.40am, when supervision commences. Students should not be on site prior to this time, unless at Camp Australia.

SCHOOL ZONE OFFENCES WHAT ARE YOU RISKING?*

FACT

Children are small, harder to see, behave unpredictably and are extremly vulnerable. They need **you** to take extra care when driving and parking around school zones

NO PARKING

No waiting. You have two minutes to drop-off or pickup. You must stay within three metres of your vehicle



NO STOPPING

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You must not stop on a length of road with a no **stopping** sign. The first **10 metres** from an **intersection** is a no stopping zone. **Yellow kerb** lines are also a no stopping zone.



BUS ZONE

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Only a public bus can stop in a bus zone



MOBILE PHONES

Extra fines apply for using a mobile phone in a school zone. May be subject to Double Demerits.



SPEEDING OFFENCES

40km/h is the limit. Children are vulnerable, so slow down in school zones. May be subject to Double Demerits.



DRIVEWAYS & FOOTPATHS

Do not park on or across a driveway or footpath.



PEDESTRIAN CROSSING

 In a queue of traffic, no part of your vehicle can stop on a pedestrian crossing.
Do not let your children in our out of a vehicle at a pedestrian crossing as this is a no stopping zone.



U TURNS

U turns are illegal on or near a pedestrian crossing and across a double white line

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DOUBLE PARKING

Double parking is illegal and is very dangerous in a school zone.
