### Werrington Wise Assembly

Last Thursday we held our Werrington Wise Assemblies in stage groupings. Congratulations to all the students who have achieved their Principal's Awards this term.

### **Morning Entry Gates**

To ensure our ability to cover all playground and gate duties each week, from term 4 the park gate will be closed each morning, this gate will still be open every afternoon.

The Armstein Crescent and Heavey Street gates will still be open each morning and afternoon.

### **Road safety**

Thank you to Penrith City Council who have re painted the approaches to our school crossing on Armstein Crescent and Heavey Street. Council Rangers regularly patrol both streets. For the safety of all of our children please ensure that you follow the road rules and the no stopping signs. Fines and demerit points for certain offences are higher in a school zone.

### **Drink Bottles**

As the weather is warming up, please make sure that your child comes to school each day with a drink bottle. Due to current COVID restrictions students can only use the bubblers to refill water bottles, not to drink directly from them.

### Year 6 Farewell, Graduation and Presentation Day.

A few weeks ago you may have heard that our Premier announced that year 12 farewells could go ahead with certain conditions. The following week the Department of Education indicated that schools could start thinking about year 6 events and that guidelines would be available to schools in Term 4. Given current circumstances,

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we are developing a variety of options, but certainly these events will be very different from previous years. As soon as the new guidelines are released and we have had time to understand and digest the implications of these guidelines, we will update parents and carers as to our approach for these events.

### School Planning and Tell Them From Me Survey

At the beginning of this term the NSW Department of Education released a new school improvement planning process and cycle. Key staff across the school are currently participating in professional learning to enable us to lead the school through this process. A critical aspect in developing a School Improvement Plan is consultation and feedback. We will be consulting and seeking feedback to help guide our School Improvement Plan from students, staff and the community. The Tell Them From Me Survey is a key consultation and feedback tool for schools.

The Tell Them From Me parent survey is open and will be available until the end of Term 3. Please assist us in our schools continual improvement journey by taking a few minutes to complete the survey. Scan the QR code to go to the survey. <u>This survey closes at the end of this</u> <u>week.</u> We have organised a short survey which you can complete at pick up and drop off with members of the school executive over the next few weeks.

### Updated COVID restrictions for schools.

Just a reminder from our update last week that all students and staff who experience cold or flu like symptoms <u>must</u> not attend school and need to be tested for COVID 19.

Students or staff who have had cold or flu like symptoms are not able to return to school until they are symptom free and have provided proof of a negative COVID 19 test to the school.

Anxiety and depression in children and adolescents



A focus on what parents can do to support their children

Parents gain knowledge regarding the symptoms displayed by children and adolescents with depression and/or anxiety. Parents gain a basic understanding of treatment, diagnosis, causes, related risk factors and practical strategies to support these children. # SCHOOL ZONE OFFENCES WHAT ARE YOU RISKING?\*

### FACT

Children are small, harder to see, behave unpredictably and are extremly vulnerable. They need **you** to take extra care when driving and parking around school zones

### **NO PARKING**

No waiting. You have two minutes to drop-off or pickup. You must stay within three metres of your vehicle



### NO STOPPING

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You must not stop on a length of road with a no **stopping** sign. The first **10 metres** from an **intersection** is a no stopping zone. **Yellow kerb** lines are also a no stopping zone.



BUS ZONE

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Only a public bus can stop in a bus zone



### MOBILE PHONES

Extra fines apply for using a mobile phone in a school zone. May be subject to Double Demerits.



### SPEEDING OFFENCES

40km/h is the limit. Children are vulnerable, so slow down in school zones. May be subject to Double Demerits.



# DRIVEWAYS & FOOTPATHS

Do not park on or across a driveway or footpath.



### PEDESTRIAN CROSSING

 In a queue of traffic, no part of your vehicle can stop on a pedestrian crossing.
Do not let your children in our out of a vehicle at a pedestrian crossing as this is a no stopping zone.



## **U TURNS**

U turns are illegal on or near a pedestrian crossing and across a double white line

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### DOUBLE PARKING

Double parking is illegal and is very dangerous in a school zone.
